

Guidelines for Using The DNF (Do Not Flush) Symbol



WHEN TO USE THE DNF SYMBOL

The Do Not Flush (DNF) symbol is required by law in California, Oregon, Washington and Illinois for wipes likely to be used in a bathroom and that have significant potential to be flushed, including:

- Baby wipes
- Bathroom cleaning wipes
- Toilet cleaning wipes
- Hard surface cleaning wipes
- Disinfecting wipes
- Hand sanitizing wipes
- Antibacterial wipes

- Facial and makeup removal wipes
- General purpose cleaning wipes
- Personal care wipes for use on the body
- Feminine hygiene wipes
- Adult incontinence wipes
- Adult hygiene wipes
- Body cleansing wipes

Guidelines for Using The DNF (Do Not Flush) Symbol



HOW TO DISPLAY THE DNF SYMBOL



PLACEMENT & SIZE

- Place the DNF symbol on the most prominent side of packaging
- For cylindrical packaging, use 40% of the package height multiplied by the container circumference to calculate
- For Film packaging, multiply the length by the width of the side most prominently displayed



COLOR & WORDING

- California, Oregon and Illinois law requires "DO NOT FLUSH" text to accompany the symbol
- Iconography "DO NOT FLUSH" phrase must be at least 2% of surface area of display panel
- The DNF symbol must be one color and have a 70% contrast w/packaging
- The symbol can be light on a dark background or vice versa
